### A Word From The Pastor

When God told the prophet Samuel to anoint another king for Israel, Samuel expected God to choose someone like King Saul. King Saul was tall, good-looking, experienced, and a born leader. But King Saul had begun to depend upon his own strength instead of the strength of the Lord. For this, God removed His Spirit from King Saul. When Samuel showed up at the house of Jesse to anoint the next

king, no one expected that the youngest and the smallest would be the one chosen. What was it that God saw in a shepherd boy that made Him decide to have David anointed as the next king? It was not his outward appearance but his inward character. It was not his skills and abilities but his faith and obedience to God. God saw what David could become. Inside all of us is great potential. We need to be willing to let God have complete control of our lives and use us in the way that He sees fit. God does not look at the outside but He looks at what is inside of us. Ask yourself the question, what is inside of me that God can use?
