A Word From Pastor Zach

There's a line in the worship song, "Hosanna," that has always made me pause. During the bridge, we all sing, "break my heart for what breaks Yours..."

Think about that concept for a minute. What is it that truly breaks God's heart? For example, when I am driving down the road and I see a stray dog and a panhandler, my reactions are totally different. I feel some compassion for the dog, but when I see the panhandler asking for money, my first thought, honestly, is usually something along the lines of "go get a job".

Why is it that I can be moved by a stray animal but am hard-hearted toward someone made in God's image? If we truly want the words of that song to ring true instead of hollow, we must spend time really looking into Scripture to see what breaks God's heart.

That is one reason why I am excited to dive into the book of Jonah with our church over the next few months. I've titled the study "Heartbroken," because I believe that as we dive deep into this well-known story, God will reveal some of the key things that break His heart.

Jonah had no desire to go and share God's love with the Assyrians, Israel's enemies. He didn't want to leave his comfort zone of Israel. Sadly, this is a problem that is not limited to the pages of Scripture. For Americans, in particular, we can fall into the

trap of seeking comfort over Christ daily. Our society is built around the idea of avoiding discomfort whenever possible. However, just like Jonah, we are called to leave our comfort zone for the sake of the gospel.

For us, that might mean going to another country, like Jonah did. However, that is not the only way to leave our comfort zone. There are people in need of the gospel all around us! Or, as a different way of looking at it, there is a harvest all around us! We just need God to soften us, make us more aware of the need, and prepare us to be used by Him.

Speaking of the harvest and opportunities that are all around us, I would invite you to pray about different ways that you can get involved in serving "the least of these" in our community. There are always ways to help with our backpack ministry and food pantry here at the church. Or, sign up to go and serve at Loaves and Fishes. It just so happens our next time to serve there is Tuesday, March 19, at 4:00 p.m. Let's make a conscious effort to be the hands and feet of Jesus in our community!

Will you join me in praying that, as we study Jonah, God will break our hearts for the things that break His?

We have sent off our first small payment to get the initial hole dug and then have the water sent off for testing. This test will reveal what specific filtration equipment they need to make the water drinkable. After we get the results back we should be able to have a final cost and a timeframe moving forward for this project. Pastor Andres and his church are overjoyed at being able to have clean water for the village and the huge ministry this will be. Please continue to pray for this project and we'll keep updating you as we know more.
