Sing for your kids and with your kids. They won't care if you sing out of tune. In fact, they might enjoy it. Maybe your child is like one of my granddaughters - who will make sure you are on the right starting pitch!

Make up songs.

- About things you see from the car window.
- About taking out the trash.
- About sharing with your brother.

Form a family band.

- Make a drum out of an old coffee can and hit it with spoons. Make shakers by pouring rice or macaroni in little plastic containers with lids. Make a tambourine from a paper plate and little bells.
- Invest in a couple of kazoos.
- Start playing music and go marching around the neighborhood! (Just kidding).

Play some interesting classical pieces for your kids. Here are 5 to get started.

- *Flight of the Bumblebee* - Rimsky-Korsakov
- *The Typewriter and a Clock* - Leroy Anderson
- *Funny Cats' Duet (Duetto Buffo Di Due Gatti)* Rossini - This is a duet for two sopranos who impersonate cats and meow all the way through the piece with a cat fight in the middle.
- *Piano Sonata in D Major K.448 - First Movement* - Mozart - It is said that students who listen to this piece for 10 minutes before taking an intelligence test get better results.
- *The Four Seasons, Spring (1st Movement)* - Vivaldi - This is perhaps the most famous work of Antonio Vivaldi; it is full of vitality and joy.

These selections are just the "tip of the iceberg." There are many classical pieces that kids enjoy. That's why *Looney Tunes* cartoons uses so many of them!

Now - for 5 important hymns to teach your children.

- *Amazing Grace (My Chains are Gone)* - Chris Tomlin version
- *Jesus Loves Me*
- *What a Friend We Have in Jesus*
- *This Little Light of Mine*
- *How Great Thou Art* - Elvis Presley version recommended
