Great is Thy Faithfulness

This beloved hymn was written by Thomas Obadiah Chisolm, a man who experienced many bouts of illness as a young adult. After he came to Christ at age 27, he took great comfort in the following text from Lamentations:

"It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning." It was this scripture that provided the inspiration for Chisolm in writing the poem *Great is Thy Faithfulness*.

The lyric was later set to music by his good friend, William Runyan. The hymn was discovered by a Moody Bible Institute professor who requested it to be sung often in chapel services. Later George Beverly Shea began to sing the hymn at Billy Graham evangelistic crusades thus *Great is Thy Faithfulness* became popular around the world.

We sing this hymn often here at Fee Fee and it has been recorded by many different artists (e.g. Stephen Curtis Chapman, CeCe Winans, Josh Turner, and Anthem Lights) to name just a few different renditions. This beautiful classic hymn has truly stood the test of time.
