A Word From Pastor Zach

irst, let me say that I am so glad to be back home! I so appreciate both Andrew and also Aaron Lumpkin from MBU for filling the pulpit while I was gone. I have heard they did a great job! While I was gone, I got to see a lot of amazing sites during my time in England. The Martyr's Square in Oxford, the Kilns where C.S. Lewis lived, and the underground bunkers where Churchill operated during WWII, among many others. However, in the midst of all that incredible history, there will be one particular moment that will be embedded into my mind for years to come.

My cohort and I traveled to St. Peter's and St. Paul's Church in Olney, England. It was here that John Newton served as the Parish Priest form 1764-1780. We got to sit in this church and sing "Amazing Grace," the hymn that Newton had penned 250 years ago.

What was amazing about this experience was to think of the incredible grace of our God. You see, Newton had followed in his father's footsteps as a sailor, and eventually became the captain of a slave ship, transporting captured Africans to the New World to be sold into bondage. Over the course of several years, God got a hold of Newton's heart, and he left his position as captain and entered into the priesthood.

Newton's radical transformation made him a significant part of the growing evangelical movement in England. He was a mentor to many, including William Wilberforce, who he encouraged to stay in politics and fight for the abolition of slavery. In addition, during his time in Olney, he counseled a troubled poet William Cowper, who wrote such hymns as "There is a Fountain Filled with Blood," during his time with Newton.

Newton, who is buried in Olney, has an interesting inscription on his tomb. It says, "Once an infidel and libertine. A servant of slaves in Africa was by the rich mercy of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ preserved, restored, pardoned and appointed to preach the faith he had long labored to destroy."

What an incredible testimony! He was an enemy of the gospel, who realized he was a slave to sin and was radically transformed by his Savior. As we sang the words of "Amazing Grace," I couldn't help but to be incredibly moved by how God had saved "a wretch like me." It was an emotional time where I was reminded again of the incredible power of the gospel to save anyone at any time.

Maybe there is a John Newton in your life. Someone whose life is so immersed in sin that you don't know how they will ever turn to Christ. Let his testimony be an encouragement to you. No one is too far from the saving hand of God! Look for opportunities to share the truth of the gospel with those around us who need it the most!

One way for us to share the gospel not just with our lips, but also with our lives in the upcoming days is through our Free Market. On Saturday, July 20, we will be having our annual event where we give away things like school supplies to our community. Let's live out the gospel by serving our community and meeting some needs. Also, while we have the Free Market, let's take advantage of opportunities to share about God's amazing grace!

America's First Book - A Hymnal!

The title of this book was originally, "The Whole Booke of Psalmes Faithfully Translated into English Metre." Quite a long title, wouldn't you say? Later it became shortened to simply "The Bay Psalm Book." This book was published in Cambridge, Massachusetts in 1640. The first edition did not contain music annotation; these were added in the 9th edition in 1698. Remarkably the book has never been out of print!

Here is how Psalm 23 appeared in the original book:

- 1. The Lord to mee a shepheard is, want therefore shall not I,
- 2. Hee in the folds of tender-grasse, doth cause me downe to lie: To waters calme me gently leads
- 3. Restore my soule doth hee: he doth in paths of righteousness: for his names sake leade mee.
- 4. Yea though in valley of deaths shade I walk, none ill I'le feare: because thou art with mee, thy rod, and staffe my comfort are.
- 5. For mee a table thou hast spread, in presence of my foes; thou dost annoynt my head with oyle. my cup it over-flowes.
- 6. Goodness & mercy surely shall all my dayes follow mee: and in the Lords house I shall dwell so long as dayes shall bee.
