#### A Word From Pastor Zach

ne of my wife's favorite sayings, which we heard from a pastor some time ago, is that "Your most important contribution in life might not be something you do, but someone you raise." We both love that quote and we are praying that our kids will grow up to be world changers for Christ. Further, I think that quote could be altered to simply say that your most important contribution in life might not be something you do, but someone you disciple.

The Great Commission commands us all to be disciple-makers. There is no exception. Think about it. Someone had to invest in you in order for you to be plugged into church! Someone discipled Billy Graham. Every great Christian leader had to be discipled by someone.

A few issues ago in the Forerunner, I wrote about William Carey, the father of the modern missions movement. During my time in England, I learned about the person who invested in William Carey. Originally, Carey was a cobbler who had joined a Baptist church in Olney (the same town where one day, John Newton would serve as a rector, albeit at a different church). That church in Olney was pastored by John Sutcliff. Sutcliff's care, friendship, and discipling of Carey helped him secure his first church.

You see, Carey was born into a poor family and had very little educational background. Regardless of formal education, he had an insatiable mind and worked on teaching himself Hebrew, Greek, and Latin. However, his lack of education and novice communication skills kept him from finding a church. Sutcliff started

discipling him and poured into him for years. In fact, the first time that Carey sought ordination and preached in front of that Baptist Church in Olney, he was told to try again in a year! However, with the mentoring of Sutcliff, he was ordained a year later and he went on to do incredible things for God's Kingdom.

To put it frankly, there would be no Carey without Sutcliff. Sutcliff stayed as the pastor of that small Baptist church in Olney. But his discipling of Carey helped birth the modern missions movement. We can't all be William Carey or Billy Graham. But we could be the next Carey or Graham's Sunday School teacher or mentor.

The truth is that each of us is called by God to be a disciple-maker. Who do you need to be discipling right now? Is it a child or grandchild, a coworker, or maybe a neighbor or friend? Prayerfully, you are already discipling someone. If so, keep at it! If not, pray right now that God would reveal to you who you can pour your life into. Come and talk with me or one of our other staff members and we can get you connected to someone. All of us need to make disciples!

One way you can do this is by volunteering in our children's ministry. From helping with our preschoolers to listening to verses in AWANA, there are a ton of children who need to be invested in every week here at Fee Fee. Pray about serving in this important ministry. Who knows, we might just have the next William Carey in our church right now. Wouldn't it great to be the John Sutcliff to that child?

**Hymn Tunes**—If you have ever perused a hymnal you may have noticed that every hymn has a hymn tune. Did you ever wonder about the sources for these tunes? From a historical perspective most tune names come from a few different sources.

<u>People</u>: Hymns are often named for their composer.

Examples: Nettleton (Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing), Darwall (Rejoice, The Lord is King), Dix (As with Gladness, Men of Old).

<u>Places</u>: Hymn tunes may be the name of the town or place of its writing.

Examples: Kingsfold (O Sing a Song of Bethlehem), Nicaea (Holy, Holy, Holy), Slane (Be Thou My Vision).

<u>Text</u>: Tune name may come from a key word, theme or phrase in the hymn.

Examples: Coronation (All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name), Diademata (Crown Him with Many Crowns) or (Soldiers of Christ, Arise).

And then there is the hymn tune *Old Hundredth* - so named because it appeared as the tune for Psalm 100 in the *Old Genevan Psalter*.
