verything that Jesus taught us is invaluable. We should make it our goal to be as familiar as possible with Him and His teaching. However, if last words are important, then certainly Jesus' final instructions to His disciples must weigh heavily on our hearts and minds. Matthew records his last words as, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20).

Jesus has given us a mission. If we've been given this mission, then it is important for us to step back and evaluate our progress every once in a while. How are we doing?

According to the U.S. Census, within just one mile of our church there are over 7,600 people! Within three miles of our church, that number jumps to over 61,000! Imagine if we were able to reach only 1% of those people within three miles of our church. That would still be God changing the lives of over 600 people! And I don't know about you, but I would see no reason why God would only want us to reach 1%. There is a harvest all around us. We need to be intentional about sharing the truth of the gospel!

All believers are called to be faithful gospel witnesses to the places we live, work, and play. We have to see ourselves as outposts of God's kingdom. We are God's representatives living in territory that needs to be claimed for Christ. It certainly seems there are more who don't believe than those of us who do believe. So our homes have to be gospel outposts in

our neighborhoods. Our desks have to be gospel outposts in our schools or offices. We have to be gospel outposts when we're out and about in the community-at the grocery store, the ballpark or the gym.

But how do we do that? It is easy to say that we need to reach people. However, sharing our faith can be incredibly intimidating. That is why we are going to spend the next 3 Sundays looking at how to share your faith without fear. We are going to be utilizing a tool, 3 Circles: A Life *Conversation Guide*. It will help equip us in how to share our faith.

The whole concept of the 3 Circles evangelism tool, which has been a major evangelistic tool utilized by our North American Mission Board, is to turn everyday conversations into gospel conversations. We are going to look at how we can share our faith with people in our spheres of influence. From relatives to coworkers to friends, we will equip you in learning how to transition to the gospel.

My challenge to each of us is to start asking God to place someone on our hearts to begin praying for opportunities to share the gospel. Pray for the Spirit to begin preparing the hearts of the lost around us. And pray that you will make the most of the opportunities that God places in front of you.

How would our church look a year from now if all of us were intentional about sharing our faith?
