A Word From Pastor Zach

n the Sermon on the Mount, Christians are challenged by Christ to let our light shine before men, so they will see our good deeds and give glory to God (Matthew 5:16). The idea is that we are so positively impacting the community that people will acknowledge there is something different about us and it will be attractive to others, even if they are unbelievers. On a very broad scale, this is seen through the disaster relief program of the Southern Baptist Convention. With Hurricane Dorian striking the Bahamas, Southern Baptists have already been deployed to go and help. The outside world and mainstream media have acknowledged how Southern Baptists are some of the first on the scene after a disaster.

With this challenge by Christ in mind, a healthy question for a church to periodically ask themselves is, "Are we making a difference in the community where God has placed us?" In other words, "Is our light shining brightly in our community?"

September 22-28, we are aiming to make sure our light is shining through a special local missions emphasis we are calling Impact Week. What is Impact Week? It is a time for our church to step out boldly and be the hands and feet of Jesus and do service projects, meet needs, and share the gospel with our community. We want for our community to experience a true impact as we coordinate together to serve our city.

To that end, we are setting the goal of giving 300 volunteer hours to our

community in one week. Now, 300 might seem like a lot, but if every person who regularly attends our church gave just one hour that week, we would easily surpass that goal. Would you be willing to commit to serving in some capacity that week?

We will have different service projects each day that week for you to choose to participate in, including: the St. Louis Area Food Bank, Feed My Starving Children, Loaves and Fishes, Meals on Wheels, our Backpack Ministry, and so much more! There will be plenty of opportunities for you to step out and serve in our community. We also will have recommendations for ways to serve our community with your family.

I love how this week of service falls naturally during our 3 Circles training. For 6 weeks on Wednesday nights, we will be learning how to share our faith without fear. This means that not only will we be able to go out and serve the community, we can also be ready to share our faith if God gives us opportunities while we are out serving!

I'm praying that through Impact Week and our 3 Circles evangelism training, we will be able to share about Christ in our community with our lives and with our lips.

Music Musings



Your Child and Music Lessons – Your schools are offering music opportunities to your kids as we begin this new academic year. Hopefully you will consider fostering your child's interest in studying music. Many activities are vying for time in your schedule, but here are a few reasons why music lessons might be an important activity for your child.

- 1. Learning to play music helps teach children how to concentrate, focus, and be patient. Children learn to be present in the moment focusing on the technique required to make the music.
- 2. Music lessons help develop speech, cognitive skills, and social abilities. Music study requires a high degree of precision in auditory processing: being *almost* in tune is not good enough. This means that musically trained children are better able to distinguish subtle details which lead to improved reading and better comprehension.
- 3. Learning an instrument boosts self-esteem. Music lessons offer an activity where children can learn to accept and utilize constructive criticism leading to accomplishing goals. Recitals and other performance opportunities will transfer confidence to non-musical areas like public speaking and leadership activities.

As parents and grandparents we have an opportunity to instill in our children the confidence that they can achieve anything they put their minds to learning. Let music be a player in helping your child experience major accomplishments that will bring satisfaction and joy in a job well done.
