City sidewalks, busv sidewalks dressed holiday style. In the air there's a feeling of Christmas....

Homes are being decorated, presents are being wrapped and Christmas has taken over the Hallmark channel. For some this may elicit feelings of excitement and joy. Yet for others, not so much. While holiday movies may be heart-warming, they may set us up for unrealistic expectations of what our holidays should look and feel like. Events may not go as planned, family members may challenge your patience, or you may find your circumstances completely different

this year. Stress creeps in. You can minimize your stress by practicing a few acts of self-kindness.

Acknowledge your feelings. If you lost a loved one this year or you're not able to be with those you love, realize that it is normal to feel sadness and grief. If you are feeling lonely or isolated, take a risk and tell someone how you are feeling. Seek out community or religious social events, volunteer, or visit shut-ins.

Be realistic. The holiday does not need to be perfect or just like last year. Be open to new experiences or start new traditions. Be careful not to get caught up in comparing your experience with social media images or those portrayed in the movies. Try to accept family members and friends as they are. Everyone is experiencing stress and it may be best to save some conversations for another day.

Plan and stick to a budget. Plan menus, shopping lists and events you will attend. Before you go gift or food shopping, decide how much money you can afford to spend and stick to your budget. Can you shop when there may be less crowds in the stores or is it an item that you can buy online? Explore low cost gift alternatives.

Learn to say "No." Saying "yes" when you should say "no" can leave you feeling resentful and overwhelmed. If saying "no" is not possible, try to remove something else from your schedule to not overload yourself.

Music Musings

Thanks, Thanks and Thanks...for the many "gophers" (go-fors), builders, and decorators who once again have assembled our gigantic tree and decorated our church so beautifully. Our Worship center, Welcome center, and foyer all look so festive as we anticipate another magnificent season of celebrating our Savior's birth.

History of Christmas Carols - Carols were first sung in Europe thousands of years ago, but these were not Christmas carols. They were pagan songs sung at the Winter Solstice celebrations as people danced around stone circles. Early Christians took over the pagan solstice celebrations – instead, celebrating Christmas by singing Christian songs. However, not many people liked these songs since they were written and sung in Latin, a language that most people couldn't understand. The people soon lost interest in celebrating Christmas by singing carols.

This was changed by St. Francis of Assisi when he began writing Nativity plays. The actors sang songs that told a story. The songs were written in the language the people could understand. They would often watch the play and join in singing.

The earliest carol was written in 1410, but sadly only a very small fragment of it still exists. It was about Mary and Jesus meeting different people in Bethlehem. Most carols at this time told untrue stories, very loosely based on the Christmas story and were seen as entertaining rather than being Sacred.

Before carol singing in public became popular, there were sometimes official carol singers called 'Waits'. They were called 'Waits' because they only sang on Christmas Eve. This was sometimes known as 'Watchnight' or 'Waitnight,' because of the shepherds were watching their sheep when the angels appeared to them. After 'Waitnight,' the Christmas celebrations began.

About this time many orchestras and choirs were being set up in the cities of England and people wanted Christmas songs to sing. Many new carols such as *Good King Wenceslas* were written in the Victorian period. New carols were created and became popular, as did the custom of singing carols in the streets. Candlelight services and services of lessons and carols soon followed. These events are celebrated and enjoyed in many countries today!
