A Favorite Carol: Mary, Did You Know - In 1970, Thomas Road Baptist Church began a Broadway-style Christmas program that was known as The Living Christmas Tree. (Does that have a familiar ring?) In 1984, the virtually unknown singer/songwriter, Mark Lowry, stepped forward to write the program for the Virginia Christmas Spectacular. Lowry designed the program around popular carols and hymns that would work well to depict the wonder of the First Christmas. Mark was writing for the event when his mother came up with the idea for the song with a simple comment. "Mark, you know if anyone knew Jesus was virgin born, it was Mary...and her silence...and her silence at the cross is proof that her story was indeed true." In the same year (1984), Lowry wrote the text for the song, but it took seven years for the lyrics to pair with the proper music. It was a Gospel music writer who came up with a tune that fit the lyrics perfectly.

By this time, Lowry had one singer in mind to record this song – Michael English. English recorded the song on an album that was released after Christmas, but it was an instant hit. This time-honored song has been recorded by over 500 artists since it was first released in 1991. The most famous versions are a duet by Kenny Rogers and Winona Judd, as well as the more recent recordings by Clay Aiken and Pentatonix.

Surely, there are many things which Mary did not know. Yet in her own song, Mary did, at least, know this: "My soul exalts the Lord, And my spirit has rejoiced in God, my Savior...For the Mighty One has done great things for me...The Lord has given help to Israel so that we remember His mercy" (Luke 1:46).

Andrew Yakel, Interim Associate Pastor Lottie Moon Christmas Offering - Masuda San was a broken man when he showed up at Mark Bennett's sidewalk chapel for the homeless in Tokyo, Japan. "It was a typical story. They come for the food," said Mark, an IMB missionary. "But while they're there, we give them a portion of Scripture and share the Gospel." And Mark learns their names—a big deal when you feel nameless and faceless, not seen by anyone. It got Masuda San's attention. It brought him out of the shadows, and he just couldn't get enough. He couldn't get enough Scripture either. He blazed through the Gospel of John and came back and asked for more. Then he asked for more again. Within six months, he had read the whole Bible. "He has this little worn-out New Testament, and it has notes and highlights," Mark said. "We'll be sitting around in Bible study, and someone will ask a question and he'll start teaching them from Scripture. He knows the Word, and the Holy Spirit is using him to teach these other guys." When you give to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering all of that money goes to support mission work like Mark does to spread the Gospel all over the world.
