### A Word From Pastor Zach

ou've probably heard by now that St. Louis County is beginning to reopen starting May 18. With that news, I'm sure you're wondering what that means for Fee Fee.

First of all, we are tentatively looking at having worship services on our campus again starting Sunday, June 7. When we reopen, we will be offering our two services at 8:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m., but there will be no Bible Study in between and no childcare or KidsZone during this first phase. We will be sending a letter out to all of our members about some of the guidelines that we are putting in place when we reopen.

If we are allowed to gather starting May 24, why are we waiting until at least June 7? You've heard the phrase "out of the abundance of caution" tossed around frequently during this COVID-19 pandemic. I've probably used it more than a few times. However, I think that we need to change the narrative with the approach of our church. Yes, we are going to be cautious. But do you know why? It is out of an abundance of love!

The Bible commands us to love our neighbors as we love ourselves. That means that we need to lovingly put others and their needs in front of our own. Out of an abundance of love, we are going to adhere to social distancing on our campus. Out of an abundance of love, we are asking that everyone who comes to worship wear a mask. Out of an abundance of love, we are asking anyone that doesn't feel well to stay home. Out of an abundance of love, we are asking that we refrain from hugs and handshakes

for the time being. It isn't fear that is going to be what motivates us during this season, but love.

No matter how you feel personally about the pandemic, I would ask that, out of an abundance of love, we don't let our opinions cause division in the church. When Jesus prays his High Priestly Prayer in John 17, he asks that God would unite all of his followers. Unity is what Christ prays for his church before he goes to the cross. I am praying that we will love others and be united around the saving truth of the gospel. We might disagree with other believers about how people and churches should be acting during this time. Let's not allow those disagreements to divide us. Instead, I'm praying we unite under the gospel and make the name of Jesus famous!

In closing, we are so appreciative of

your prayers and support during this season. Your staff believes that God is doing something in and through this uncertain time. Please join us in praying for revival! Also, for those of you who are high risk, don't feel pressure to return right away. We will continue to livestream our services and will have staff members online during our services to minister to you. Finally, know that we will do our best to communicate any changes in a clear and timely way, as this reopening unfolds. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact us. Be looking for the letter that will give more details about the different phases Fee Fee Baptist will undergo as we reopen.

Please join me in praying for our church, our city, our nation, and our world!

He needed \$7 to be able to pay for his room tonight and asked if we had any chili for their dinner. I gave him some microwavable food, breakfast bars, \$7 and prayed with him. He thanked Jesus for providing.

There are more "Georges" all around you. While I have been typing this article, I had a phone call from a woman asking for info about our Mobile Market on May 18. God is using His church to help those in need. Keep your eyes open. Look for opportunities to help. Some needs are physical, some emotional, and some spiritual. Let Jesus use you!

## **Music Musings**

**Did You Know...** Many of our popular hymns have interesting backstories.

The song I Know Whom I Have Believed was written by a Union soldier during the Civil War, who was held as a prisoner of war and became a believer while praying for another dying soldier.

Hymn writer Fanny Crosby was blind from infancy yet was able to memorize the first five books of the Bible, the four Gospels, the Proverbs, and most of the Psalms.

But one song in particular, of which many of us have grown to adore, has an inspiring origin.

Carl Boberg, a newspaper editor, and member of the Swedish Parliament, being inspired by the sound of church bells ringing during a wild thunderstorm, penned the poem, *O Great God*. When *O Great God* was published, the poem did not catch on and it seemed destined to be forgotten. However, three years later someone liked it enough to match the words with a Swedish melody. Boberg published the poem again in 1891 - this time in the form of a song.

A few decades later in the 1930s, English missionary Stuart Hine heard the song while in Poland. He was deeply moved, translated the song to English and took it home with him to England. In English, the song was now called *How Great Thou Art*.

Moving on to the 1940s, an evangelist heard this song being sung by native tribal people in India, of all places! The evangelist, Dr. Edwin Orr, was deeply inspired and brought the song to the United States. In 1954 the song found its way into the hands of George Beverly Shea, who sang it over 100 times in Billy Graham's 1957 New York crusade. In 1959 it became the theme song for Billy Graham's weekly radio broadcast.

The song later became recognized by ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers) as "The All-Time Outstanding Gospel Song" in America. How Great Thou Art has consistently been listed as one of the greatest hymns ever written, usually falling in second place right behind Amazing Grace, and has been recorded over 1,800 times in the last 50 years. Many of you have no doubt heard the recordings by Elvis Presley and it was also recorded in 2017 by popular country artist Alan Jackson.

How astonishing that this song started as a poem in a small Swedish town and somehow wound its way around the globe to become a great hymn of the faith.

Taken from Mrs. Charles E. Cowman's "Streams in the Desert," Volume Two "This is the victory that hath overcome the world, even our faith," (1 John 5:4)

Oh, the wonders of prayer! Abraham's servant prays...Rebekah appears. Jacob wrestles and prays and prevails with Christ...Esau's mind is wonderfully turned from the revengeful purpose he has harbored for twenty years. Moses cries to God...the sea divides. Dare to be definite with God; dare to lay hold of the promises and to wait in faith until the answer comes. Victory is through Calvary!

Mission Trip Updates - Out of an abundance of caution regarding COVID-19, all of our summer mission trips (Dominican Republic trip, youth trip to North Carolina, and Windermere trip), have all been cancelled. This was not an easy decision at all but we, and all of the organizations we were working with, felt that this is the wise decision. Please still be praying for all of these groups and the work that they do. Also, let me take this opportunity to update you on the Dominican Republic Water Project. The well has been dug and initial equipment has been put in place! A couple months ago we sent a payment to have the building constructed. Because of all the COVID-19 concerns, the construction has been put on hold for the time being. We have one final payment to send to pay for the rest of the equipment within the building. If you would still like to give to support missions this summer, you can give towards the "DR Water Project" to help pay for that equipment. We are almost at the finish line for this project and I can't wait for the day when our partner village is finally drinking clean water!
