Devotional Corner

Taken from L.B. Cowman's "Streams in the Desert," Zondervan Updated Edition

Elisha prayed, "O Lord, open his eyes so that he may see," (2 Kings 6:17).

This is the prayer we need to pray for ourselves and one another: "Lord, open our eyes so we may see." We are surrounded, just as the prophet Elisha was, by God's "horses and chariots of fire" (2 Kings 6:17), waiting to transport us to places of glorious victory.

Once our eyes are opened by God, we will see all the events of our lives, whether great or small, joyful or sad, as a "chariot" for our souls. Everything that comes to us becomes a chariot the moment we treat it as such. On the other hand, even the smallest trial may

become an object crushing everything in its path into misery and despair if we allow it.

The difference then becomes a choice we make. It all depends not on the events themselves but on how we view them. If we simply lie down, allowing them to roll over and crush us, they become an uncontrollable car of destruction. Yet if we climb into them, as riding in a car of victory, they become the chariots of God to triumphantly take us onward and upward.

There is not much the Lord can do with a crushed soul. That is why the Adversary attempts to push God's people toward despair and hopelessness over their condition or the condition of the church. It has often been said that a discouraged army enters a battle with the certainty of defeat. Recently a missionary said she had returned home sick and disheartened because her spirit had lost its courage, which led to the consequence of an unhealthy body.

We need to better understand these attacks of the Enemy on our spirit and how to resist them. If he can dislodge us from our proper position, he then seeks to "wear out the saints of the Most High" (Dan. 7:25) through a prolonged siege, until we finally, out of sheer weakness, surrender all hope of victory.

A Word From Pastor Zach

a joy it was for us to celebrate

weekend! I am so thankful for the hope that we have in Jesus! It is remarkable to think that the same power that conquered the grave lives in each of us! I am praying that our church will continue to proclaim that truth to a world that desperately needs hope.

Gallup released a study a few months ago that I found very telling concerning our need for hope. As you know, 2020 was an incredibly taxing year for all of us mentally. In fact, this poll by Gallup found that nearly every demographic group saw a decrease in their mental health from 2019 to 2020. It did not matter if you were male or female or married or single. It didn't matter your race or your socioeconomic status. It didn't matter what political party you were affiliated with. It didn't matter your age. Every single demographic saw a decrease in mental health except for one category.

What was that category? Weekly religious service attendance. The only demographic that saw their mental health increase from 2019 to 2020 were those people who attended weekly religious services. Isn't that remarkable?

I think it says something profound about the need that we all have for Biblical community. We are not meant to live our lives alone. We truly need each other! We need each other for encouragement and we need each other for our own mental health!

In the tenth chapter of Hebrews, there are a series of "let us" imperatives that the writer challenges us to do as a church:

¹⁹ Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have boldness to enter the sanctuary through the blood of Jesus— 20 he has inaugurated for us a new and living way through the curtain (that is, through his flesh)— 21 and since we have a great high priest over the house of God, 22 let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed in pure water. 23 **Let us hold on** to the confession of our hope without wavering, since he who promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider one another in order to provoke love and good works, 25 not neglecting to gather together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging each other, and all the more as you see the day approaching.

Because of what Jesus has done for us, we want to draw near to God with one another. We want to hold on to our confession of hope. And we want to consider how to stir one another to love and good deeds. We do this by not neglecting to gather with one another!

I know this past year has been crazy. We know this world needs hope. I want to encourage you to continue to gather with us weekly, whether in person or online, as we encourage each other. We are truly better together, church family! And not only are we better together, but according to this Gallup poll, we are healthier mentally as well!

Lord, I Can Suffer thy Rebukes - The text of this hymn was written by Isaac Watts. The tune was by Mozart. Here is the first verse of the hymn:

Lord, I can suffer Thy rebukes, When Thou with kindness dost chastise; But Thy fierce wrath I cannot bear: O let it not against me rise.

Blest Be the Man Whose Bowels Move – This is another hymn written by the great hymn writer Isaac Watts. "Bowels" as referenced in scripture are the seat of emotions. It's that realization that your feelings come from deep within. Here is the first verse of the hymn:

Blest is the man whose bowels move And melt with pity to the poor; Whose soul by sympathizing love, Feels what his fellow saints endure.

Although Isaac Watts composed the text for these two "strangely titled" hymns, he is best known for writing text for When I Survey the Wondrous Cross and Joy to the World.

If Men Go to Hell, Who Cares – This hymn was written by E.M. Bartlett in 1939. In the first verse and chorus, you can clearly see the underlying message of the hymn is all about CARING.

While the world rushes on in its folly and sin, And men go down in despair To reign where demons are shrieking within, *If men go to hell, who cares?*

Who cares, who cares, O Lord, who cares? While the world rushes on in sin to despair: *If men go to hell, who cares?*

A very popular hymn written (text and music) by Bartlett is Victory in Jesus. An interesting piece of trivia...Bartlett was from Waynesville, MO!
